

About Women's Aid ABCLN

- Women's Aid ABCLN provides confidential support, information and emergency accommodation for women and children affected by domestic abuse across Antrim, Ballymena, Carrickfergus, Larne and Newtownabbey.
- We offer one to one support, practical assistance and group work for women in the community.
- We provide specialised services and support for children and young people affected by domestic abuse.
- We believe that no-one should have to live in fear or threat from abuse.
- Knowing that help is available, that there is a way out of the domestic abuse they have experienced enables women to transform their lives.
- Through early intervention and preventative work, we challenge attitudes and beliefs which lead to male violence against women.
- Together we are working to end domestic abuse.

Why Volunteer

Firstly, we need your help – we are a small team with a big reach. Last year we supported almost 1,500 women and over 700 children across Antrim, Ballymena, Carrickfergus, Larne and Newtownabbey. The Safe Have Garden provides a safe space for women - whether that is having a chat and a cuppa with another woman, volunteer or their Domestic Abuse Specialist, doing some work in the garden or to take a moment outdoors during a course or workshop. We want the garden to be calm and welcoming space for everyone.

Boosts Employee Engagement, Morale and Loyalty - A 2017 Deloitte Volunteer Survey showed that 70% of those surveyed felt that volunteer activities are likely to boost employee morale, and 74% believed that volunteering provides a sense of purpose.

Improves employee health and wellness - While doing positive for others can make people feel good, the benefits run much deeper than that. According to the Mayo Clinic, volunteering improves physical health and mental wellness.

Builds team relationships - When employees spend time together doing meaningful activities away from their regular employment environment, they get to know each other in different and more personal ways.

Positive company image - According to a 2020 article by The Chronicle of Philanthropy, 78% of the 7000 respondents of a multi-national survey responded favourably to companies with corporate social responsibility (CSR) initiatives. The survey revealed that 33% of respondents claimed to always or (or at least regularly) consider a company's CSR before making a purchase.
